Report on Bhangar School

March, 2008

In English, the children are learning the alphabet from A to Z in capital and small letter English names of different animals and objects such as Dog, Cat, Pencil, Book, Door and Windows etc are being taught to them.

In Bengali, the children are learning to write words and make sentences.

In Arithmetic, they are learning addition, subtraction and arrangement of numerals.

April, 2008

In English, they have progressed further in learning alphabet and telling rhymes.

In Bengali, they are learning to write down their own names and address, make sentences and do reading.

In Arithmetic, they have progressed further in addition subtraction and numerical.

May, 2008

We have admitted Eight children of our school to different formal schools and 3 more children are expected to be admitted in such schools.

We have admitted fresh children in our school and they are now learning the beginners, lessons in English, Bengali and Arithmetic.

On 7th May, 2008 'Rabindra Jayanti' (Birth day of the World Poet Tagore) was held in the school. The children and their mothers participated in Tagore songs, dance and recitations. After the function was over, snacks were distributed among the children. It was a thoroughly enjoyable function.

In addition to textual lessons, the teachers teach the children singing, dancing and recitations. They are also given lessons on hygienic habits and cleanliness and made to do P.T. Exercises.

Special Support Sessions (Coaching Classes)

Special support or coaching classes are absolutely necessary specially for the children who have been admitted to formal schools as the atmosphere in underprivileged families are not at all congenial to systematic studies. As a result, these students often drop out from schools and discontinue their academic career. To stop such an eventuality we have set up special support sessions us Howrah and Panditiya, where the students mainstreamed by us to formal schools are given proper and careful coaching along with our own students who are in need of such coaching.
